Quick Practice Plan for Busy Adults

Daily Goal: 15 minutes (or less!)

3 min: Finger warm-up or basic chord shapes

7 min: Practice a simple song or chord change

5 min: Play something just for fun

*Tip: Leave your guitar out where you can see it.
Visibility = accessibility.*
